

The German GEW magazine reports about the experience with an intern from Jordan

– An [example par excellence](#) for a successful internship in Germany –

GJU student Naser Al-Malkawi, studying Energy Engineering, is currently doing his internship at GEW. GEW Wilhelmshaven GmbH is an important energy and drink water supplier located in the north of Germany.

GEW devoted a special report about Naser Al-Malawi's internship in its magazine titled: "Multiculti meets total local".

In the article Naser particularizes about the important chance to do his internship in Germany and especially at the GEW company. He is happy to gain such valuable experiences in his internship after he finished his study term at the Jade University of Applied Science in Wilhelmshaven. The Sales Manager of GEW, Colin Wulff, highlights the win-win situation for himself and for Naser Al-Malkawi. Through him, Colin Wulff, stressed out, he learned a lot about Jordan, the Jordanian culture and life. For Naser this internship is a great chance to apply what he learnt during his studies.

Naser Al-Malkawi is working mainly in two projects: to develop a concept for the service maintenance agreement extension of the Jade Wind Park and doing examinations of the local heating net of the German Armed Forces. Those topics are tailor-made for the young Jordanian. In Jordan renewable energies are still a new field of interest but with a huge potential for development.

Naser Al-Malkawi emphasizes his enthusiasm for the block heat and power station units of GEW: "The combined heat and power station and the biogas plant aren't usually used in Jordan."

Besides doing this internship he had the possibility to travel in Germany and he loves eating "Schnitzel". He stressed out that lots of things are easier in Germany than in Jordan but he stated that the weather is so much better in Jordan.

In the summer Naser Al-Malkawi will come back to Amman and to GJU to write his bachelor thesis. But after that he won't stay longer in Jordan: he wants to see the world and work on projects related to renewable energy in Germany - since that is where the future lies. Colin Wulff valued his intern who couldn't have done it any better!
