Field report – or how I experience Jordan

I wanted to live in the Middle East for a long time and was very happy to get the opportunity to realize that by spending one semester at the GJU here in Jordan.

Three months ago I was also a bit afraid that I will not get a good variety of food since I do not eat meat. Exactly the opposite is true – I really love Jordanian food!

After three months I have finally seen a bit of the wonderful countryside where I was hiking. I saw many different places – inside and outside the city - but I am nevertheless very excited to see and experience more.
