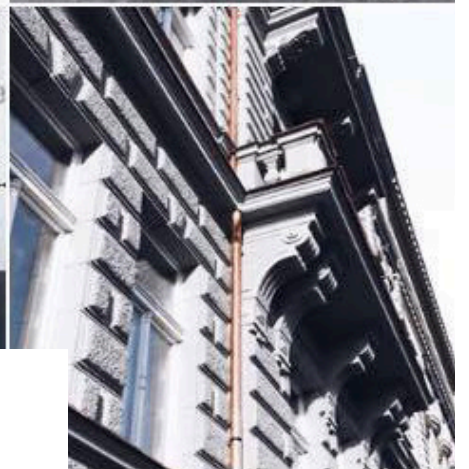
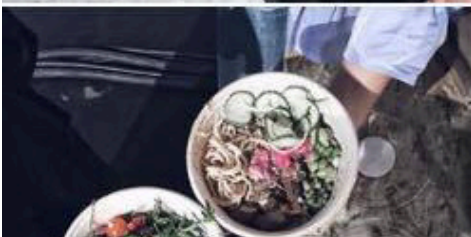
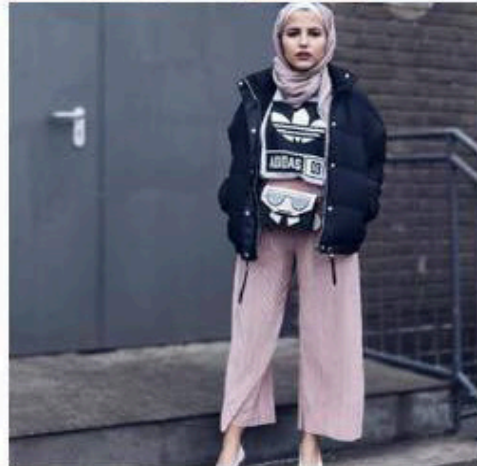

“The Program for innovation and Entrepreneurship (PIE) in cooperation with the office for industrial links (OIL) have organized and brought together the ‘Green Hackathon’ event, whereby tens of GJU students from various majors came together in ‘The Uminah Think Tank’ to come up with green solutions and entrepreneurship ideas to solve a number of local environmental issues. 57 students made up a number of 17 total teams taking on different challenges.”

Students were given a 3 day period of brainstorming and idea execution, in which most set up simplified business models and working project prototypes. Technical and business mentors were there to guide the teams throughout. The ideas were then presented to a stream of judges including; Dr.Natheer AbuObeid, Fadi Marji, Sami Jarrar, Faisal alHaqqi, and Ruba el Zoubi.

The winning team, consisting of students: Sara Khashmar, Ahmad Qudah, Majd Al-Saadi, and Abdulrahman Rababa’a who had developed a simplified and green method for solar heating in refugee camps. In second place came the team members, Dina Jaber, AlHarith Farhad, Shahd Shamout, and Mohammed Noor Al-Jbour, for their development of sustainable house systems for rural areas. In third place arrived the team members Roya Abu Summaqah, Mohammed Ghanim, Rahaf Ghanim, and Mohammed Fageer, for their development of self-cleaning solar cells for the lighting of rural areas.

Honorable rewards and thank you notes were given to the other teams, for their ideas for green challenges.

The 3 most distinguishable teams were awarded 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place positions along with a cash reward and the opportunity to further develop their innovative solutions.\*

### ROBOTICS CLUB

A group of students interested in initiating technology related activities started a club which grew into a real community. Students in the club initiate university activities to share and deliver their technical knowledge with the rest of the students, hoping to prepare students for future projects in the field of their course or robotics. Hence, they aim to allow the students with theoretical knowledge to gain an experimental application. One example is the robotics show. With proposed themes such as; games and interaction between robots and users, the students learned to launch projects in the field of robotics like building and programming robots.

Indeed, many students often join the club to gain help and technical experience that are required to succeed in assigned projects of their courses like instrumentation and control systems. In fact, the club launched a five-week course in Arduino basic, CATIA, and Raspberry PI in November and plan on future advanced courses like MATLAB throughout this semester. Make sure to check their facebook page GJU Robotics club for the all the club's activities, offered courses, and registration links to the courses.

Last but not least, the club believes in its responsibility to deliver their knowledge to everyone in the university as well as our community. An example to that is their visit to governmental schools in Madaba, to offer students free courses in vital robotics and basic Arduino considering the scarce resources and knowledge they receive in this field.

### IT CLUB

Passion is why we have an IT club in our university. Students from computer oriented majors deliver their passion in what they study, to inform others all about

computer science and technology, and help students to look deeper into the operation of routinely used devices such as digital watches, calculators, or mobile phones. The club offers the basic knowledge in programming through launching several courses each semester, interactive activities, events and revision classes.

The club offers revision classes and video recordings in basic programming courses like Java and C (which is a basic course that supports all CS 113, 115, and 116 students). The IT club will also provide courses in gaming development in unity 3D and hence teach students how to program their own games. Moreover, other courses like Basics Android Development and Excel are on the club's current plan for this semester. In addition, Hour of Code and Code Camp, which is a three-day comprehensive event, is the highlight of the upcoming events that you can read more about on the club's page, GJU IT Club.

“All you need is your computer and attending”, assured the club's president, emphasizing that no previous knowledge is required to join any of the basic offered courses.

### MUN CLUB

The MUN (Model United Nations) was born from the need to experience the MUN challenge in a university level. The major signature of the MUN club throughout the year is through its three days' conference. The conference is a stimulation of the real life UN. The main aim of the MUN conference is to “host thought-provoking debates that would broaden your perspectives on international politics and develop your negotiation skills.” as quoted from the 2016 MUN guide. Students who participate as delegates are given highly effective or averagely effective countries to represent, based on their experience with MUN. “The

most interesting part is the debates that happen in the session” the club’s president emphasizes as he points out that the major advantage of the session is that it “combines between the fun and learning, it develops the speaking skills of the students, and offers a relief to students from the university’s stress.” Moreover, all participants receive an official certificate from the university that enriches their CV if well used and presented to institutions. The club offers workshops and gatherings when required to train students and prepare them before the conference. As more and more students join each year, the majority becomes well acquainted with the procedures of the sessions and regulations.

The MUN club understands the importance of delivering the learned values in the MUN sessions to the real community through community service, where they distributed school stationery to students in less privileged governmental schools in Madaba. After two successful MUN conferences, the third was conducted in the last week of November this semester and hoping for a fourth one next semester too.

### **BOOK BUSTERS CLUB**

It was estimated through a survey that the number of books read in the Middle East is 0.5 books and the number of books read in the USA is 11 books a year. 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# WHAT'S NEW IN TECH

These few months have been quite loaded in terms of new tech. We had the reveal of Google's-own smartphone, innovative products from old and new companies, and a possible Nintendo comeback? Welcome to the very first issue of What's New In Tech!

## Meet the Nexus Successor: Pixel by Google!

Many of tech-savvy Android users are familiar with Google's Nexus devices. The developer-friendly environment, instant software updates, and an attractive price tag, made the Nexus phones an excellent choice for Android enthusiasts. Unfortunately, they failed to make an impact on the market the way Samsung and Apple do. This time however, Google is attempting to change that; for better or worse. On October 4th, Google unveiled the Pixel and Pixel XL. Both versions offer top-of-line hardware and interesting software features. The Pixel XL has a 2560x1440 5.5-inch display, while the smaller Pixel has a 1920x1080 5.0-inch display, both AMOLED. Battery capacities are 3,450mAh for the XL, and 2,770mAh for the Pixel, both Non-removable. The phones are identical everywhere else, 12.3MP back/8MP front cameras, fingerprint sensors, 4G LTE and \*ahem\* headphone jacks. Baked into Android 7.1 on the Pixel devices is the new Google Assistant, a chattier version of Google Now. It features automatic daily forecasts based on your frequent searches, smart replies, image recognition and

fun interactions. It remains to be seen if Google will win people over this, especially with the competition not only from industry giants, but also from rising Chinese OEMs offering similar spec'd phones for at least half the price.





### The Xiaomi Mi MIX: Bezel me this...

And on the topic of Chinese OEMs, Xiaomi released possibly one of the most innovative smartphones design-wise, the bezel-less Mi MIX! The screen itself is a 6.4-inch 2048x1080 IPS LCD, with an insane 91.3% screen to body ratio. The front camera is on the bottom, and call audio is allowed via ceramic vibrations from a piezoelectric speaker at the bottom. Also, a sonar-based sensor is used for proximity detection! On top of all that, the phone packs the latest Snapdragon 821 chipset backed by either 4 GB or 6 GB (depending on the version), 16 MP rear/5 MP front cameras and a large 4,400mAh battery. So what is the catch here? Unfortunately, being a proof-of-concept device, it will be very limited in quantity, and importing one is a very tricky task. Still, it is a breath of fresh air in terms of smartphone design that hopefully pushes other companies to pursue more creative ideas.



### The New MacBook Pro 2016: Now with Touch Bar.

On October 27th, Apple announced a new update to its laptop lineup, the MacBook Pro 2016. It comes in two variants, 13-inch and 15-inch. Both sport a familiar overall design, with a couple of additions sprinkled in (and some omissions). For starters, the standard USB ports have been replaced with 4 USB-C new ones, and the SD card slot and Thunderbolt port have been removed. Thankfully, a headphone jack is still available. The 15-inch model and the 13-inch model are both 20% and 17% thinner, respectively. The Apple logo on the back is now metallic. Perhaps the most interesting addition is the Touch Bar, a new dynamic touch screen replacing the function keys. It provides various functions depending the application running. You can answer FaceTime calls, navigate through Safari, scroll through photos/videos, access emojis, use Touch ID for authentication and add custom shortcuts. The 15-inch model comes with a sixth-generation Intel Core i7 and Radeon Pro graphics combination, and the 13-inch model comes with a Core i7/i5 and Intel Iris graphics. Shipping starts in 3-4 weeks, with a non-Touch Bar version available immediately.

### The New Surface Studio: Hybrid Beast.

On the other side of the laptop spectrum, Microsoft is heavily banking on the hybrid tablet/laptop setup with its new Surface Studio. As the name suggests, the massive 28-inches Surface Studio is aimed for designers and creative professionals. It comes with an Intel Core i7 processor coupled with NVIDIA GeForce graphics and 2 terabytes of storage. Running on Windows 10, Cortana (Microsoft's voice assistant) is included and integrated with third party design programs. The new peripheral that truly caught people's attention however was the Surface Dial. It is basically a puck-like device that adds an extra tool in your design arsenal. Similar to the dynamic Touch Bar in the new MacBook, the Dial provides functions depending on the app you're using. It can be used as a colour picker in drawing apps, contextual menus, undo-redo functions, dials in music editing apps and many more. It's good to see Apple and Microsoft going neck-and-neck and giving us new sweet tools to play with!

### Nintendo Switch: Can Nintendo survive the console wars?

Nintendo is in a rough patch these days. Despite the impressive 3DS sales, Nintendo's contender in the living room, the WiiU, has been struggling to reach the PS4 and the Xbox One -let alone compete- and has been discontinued. Now, with the PS4 and Xbox One aiming to release beefed-up 4K capable models in the forms of PS4 Pro and Scorpio, Nintendo is taking a different approach. Meet the Nintendo Switch: a hybrid console/portable gaming system. At home, the Switch sits in a dock connected to the TV. You can remove it from the dock and "instantly" continue playing on the portable screen. Controllers are detachable and can be shared for local multiplayer. The system packs a custom high-end NVIDIA Tegra processor with a new physics engine and advanced game tools. Big gaming companies like Activision, EA, Ubisoft, WB, Konami, Bethesda and many others are developing high quality titles for the system, with also first-party titles from Nintendo, such as The Legend Of Zelda Breath of The Wild, Mario Kart, and a new 3D Mario game. People are so far split on Nintendo's venture however. Some applaud the company for trying new things instead of aiming for just brute power, and some doubt if the Switch can survive a console environment focused mainly on amazing graphics and blockbuster titles. You can expect the Switch to be available in stores on March 2017.

# MAKING a MURDER

“Trump’s election, Brexit, ISIS, those and many more are the news making the headlines. Many of us are left wondering, how did extremism reach power and when did racism become a campaign seller? Is there a way we could have foretold this future or could we fix this mess the world is making? ”

According to Mamdouh Al-edwan in his book ‘the animalization of humans’ \* which is a compilation of works of literature. There are 3 main components for a human being to become capable of hurting another (whether mentally or emotionally) and sometimes lead to murder, those are:

## **1.THE PRESENCE OF A HIGHER POWER OR AUTHORITY**

This higher power could be an official, someone higher in military ranks or even the illusion of a higher power (a god or a mythical being) willing to take the blame off of you. Just like in the movie ‘I for Icareus’ where a social experiment showed that more than 60% of the people are willing to implement hurt on others if there is a higher authority giving the orders and taking the blame.

## **2.DISTRIBUTION OF TASKS**

If the person is psychologically led to believe that he is only following the orders and has just this one task, he is willing to turn a blind eye on the consequences of this one task. In Nazi’s concentration camps one of the methods of execution and the most used, was actually

shooting the victims through a small hole in the wall, saying that there is no one behind this wall and it is only an experiment. Whether the soldier knew at that time or not, it didn’t matter, because his mind understood the smaller task which is simply pull the trigger. ‘Sabra and Shatila’ and many more masacres used this distribution of commands so that each group carries out one action missing out that they are all causing the same harm.

*“What if you found out that the thing you mistreat the most, makes you a better person”*

“We all aim to be the best versions of ourselves, hoping that by the end of the day we feel good and not filled with regret. What if you found out that the thing you mistreat the most, makes you a better person? Many of us go around our daily lives, not really thinking about the environment surrounding us. We never really stop and consider the consequences of our actions that lead to big and terrifying reactions. Each one of us thinks that what they do will not make a difference as they are just one individual, but this is where things start to go south.”

If we do not start being Environmentally Conscious, then we will be aiding the already existing major issues that have become the normal state of what is becoming our Earth. Pollution, global warming and climate change are not okay.

In 2009, a peculiar study was conducted by psychologist Netta Weinstein. In this study, she showed people pictures

of both natural and urban landscapes. She then proceeded to ask them questions about their life goals. The people, who were shown pictures of natural landscapes, responded with answers concerning the community and human connection goals. However, those shown the urban landscapes did not. Thus, Netta Weinstein’s conclusion was that nature “brings individuals closer to others, whereas human-made environments orient goals toward more selfish or self-interested end.” Another series of experiments were conducted on the matter by Juyoung Lee in 2014. The study explored “the potential impact of nature on the willingness to be generous, trustful, and helpful toward others, while considering what factors might influence that relationship.” The researchers showed the participants beautiful nature scenes varying in their beauty and then observed their behavior while playing two economic games; The Dictator Game and The Trust Game. The participants who were shown the more beautiful scenes acted more generously and more trusting than those who were shown less beautiful scenes. They then explored a different aspect in where,



sitting in a room filled with beautiful plants, they told the participants that the experiment was done and they could leave. However, they could volunteer to make paper cranes for a relief effort program in Japan if they want to. The number of cranes made, per individual was used to measure their willingness to help. It was concluded that the presence of more beautiful plants greatly increased the number of cranes made. This is due to the positive emotion generated by natural beauty. This emoting invoke is thought to be due to a feeling of awe, where we get the sense of being part of something bigger. This leads to voluntary behavior intended to benefit others.

Despite all the benefits that the environment gives us, humans are destroying it at a rate that has never been done. Carbon Dioxide levels are the highest they have ever been and species are going extinct at a rate more than 100 times faster than before. Deforestation is decreasing forest areas and putting the lives of animals in danger. Each year, billions of plastic bags are being made. One hundred billion of these bags are thrown away according to Worldwatch Institute, with less than one percent actually ending up in the recycling bin. Moreover, a study concluded that one half of all plants and animal species on dry land, are at risk of extinction by the year 2050 due to global warming. As stated by the World Resources Institute, 100 species die each day due to tropical deforestation. The state, in which we are currently in, is truly depressing.

We are poisoning nature with our thoughtless behavior. It is good to remind ourselves every now and then, why we should work so hard to protect the environment. The list of the reasons why, could go on and on. But sadly, the list of how we are destroying it does too. It provides us with so many benefits, that we often forget about. The problem, we also face nowadays, is that people rarely go outside anymore. Therefore, it's harder to appreciate what you are not aware of. Going outdoor can make you smarter, healthier, kinder, less stressed and more creative. So go outside, and protect the greatness that is the environment.

*“Climate change or commonly known as global warming, is one of the most basic and infamous scientific explanations to an observed phenomenon, that has been occurring nonstop for the last million years.”*

As a person living in the 21st century, you would expect this issue to be known between the average adults. Yet to my horror, the leader of the world's arguably strongest country is “skeptical” about the validity of the science behind it. As he argues: “The concept of global warming was created by and for the Chinese in order to make U.S. manufacturing non-competitive.” We all should stop and ask ourselves: how could something like this even be true? Not to throw shade at the American electoral qualification requirements and process, but especially during this period of time, where science has a huge and tangible effect on our lives and our collective species.

Well the answer lies in the common way, in which we treat life and the things it throws at us, understanding skills, processing ability and an active choice inciting emotional and mental recognition of information plays a huge role in dealing with new information. Although many people choose to not believe in foreign ideas at the spot, many actually go through it and take it in wholly. Yet, that does not mean they choose to act on this new knowledge. As we are social animals, we tend to weigh the direct or indirect threat of the new information we acquire against the direct danger of unconformity from the social group, in which we are born in or choose to surround ourselves with, and the end result is either a state of bigotry, denial,

or lack of values. But in reality when the common person believe they know what climate change is, regardless of their stance on it, is confronted with the opportunity to explain the way in which it operates, they fail to deliver a viable response as it has been proven in the outcome of many professionally conducted studies on varying population sample, and thus what is the physical or chemical mechanism in which climate change takes place? In order for us to understand how climate change works we have to understand what the climate is. The climate is simply defined as the weather of a geographic area spread over a time period.

At first, I'd like to explain the meaning of climate change at the level in which no human interference is present: As the earth constantly rotates around the luminous sun, it absorbs the energy which it emits in the known form of light usually within the visible human spectrum. And so with anything out of matter, it has to release that excess energy, and because the earth is much cooler than the sun, it can only release the energy in the lower form of infrared light, which is below our ability to see, and that's why the earth doesn't glow and isn't classified as a luminous astronomical object. In minimalistic terms, the earth

transforms most of the energy it receives from the sun into infrared light. Green house gases like Methane and Carbon Dioxide, which are abundant in the atmosphere, allow visible light that reaches the earth to pass through, but absorbs the emitted infrared light causing the atmosphere to retain heat, this energy can be absorbed and reemitted by the atmosphere many times before it returns to space in the form of light. The added time this process gives, helped keep the atmosphere warm enough for the planet to support and sustain life in the known range of atmospheric requirement for the incubation of life as we know it. Although we now know that life could thrive in extreme environments, like the freezing depth of the sea where the sun doesn't reach the bottom, scorching hot water springs or radioactive areas. Nevertheless, the human body adapted to the heat levels of the planet. Without the green house affect the earth's surface temperature would be 27.8 Co cooler, which is well below the freezing point of water.

So how have humans changed the environment?

Since the dawn of the industrial age, around the year 1750, the amount of atmospheric Carbon Dioxide increased by 40% and Methane had almost tripled. These increases caused extra infrared light absorption, meaning an extra Green House effect which has caused earth to heat above it's typical heat range. In other word, energy that gets to earth has a harder time leaving the earth, even light. Which in turn, causes the increase of the globe's heat levels thus creating what is known as global climate change.

This scientific hypothesis is vastly accepted amongst the scientific community with a lot of data and research to back up the claims and terms of the hypothesis, that explains the astounding 97% of the scientific community who agree upon that. Yet, the denial amongst those who are educated an uneducated is still visible, regardless of the scientific proofs against that. Which is totally fine, since everyone is entitled to their own reality. But when it comes to politics and legislation, science is no opinion. And as comforting as it is, to think of climate change as fiction or a fact of the future, it has reached way beyond that. And it's a matter of present change, affect and an actual direct threat. Therefore, this is why it's very important to turn to science on the issues that concern the wellbeing of the whole entirety of species. We can no longer afford to be skeptical about the role science plays, we have to either educate ourselves or recognize our inadequacy to give opinion on the things we have no prior experience or knowledge in. Nonetheless, give power to someone to decide our faith for us.

# Inter - kulturalität

*“Der Begriff Interkulturalität hat viele Bedeutungen. Eine dieser Bedeutungen.”*

Ist die historische und gegenwärtige Verhältnisse von Menschen aller Kulturen der Welt. D. h. die Art und Weise wie die Menschen einer Kultur sich früher und heutzutage in den Alltag Situationen verhalten. Dies beinhaltet auch solche Themen wie zum Beispiel, Gesellschaften, Sprachen, Religionen, Essen, und usw. Sprachen sind der Schlüssel zur Welt der Kommunikation, denn ohne Sprachen gäbe es keine Kommunikation. Sie dienen als Brücken und bringen die Menschen bzw. die Kulturen nah zueinander, indem Menschen miteinander kommunizieren, und das geschieht besonders gut durch Sprachen. Man sollte andere Kulturen kennenlernen, indem man Sprachen anderer Kultur lernt. Warum ??.

Die Antwort auf diese Frage ist nicht so einfach. Erstens, viele finden das Lernen von Sprachen anderer Menschen interessant. Das stimmt, aber es reicht leider nicht nur die Sprache zu lernen, um die Kultur zu kennen. Zweitens, man lernt Sprache und Kultur anderer Menschen kennen, um Unterschiede zu erkennen, und Missverständnisse zu vermeiden, und mit anderen Kulturen zu vergleichen. Der einfachste Weg eine Kultur zu kennen ist die Kommunikation mit den Menschen dieser Kultur und in dem Land dieser zu leben.

Welche Unterschiede gibt es zwischen Kulturen? Ein einfaches Beispiel dafür ist die Begrüßung. In Jordanien zum Beispiel fängt man die Begrüßung mit „Al Salam w Alaikom“ - Friede sei mit Dir/Euch! - und gleichzeitig Händeschütteln an und dann je nachdem, in welchem arabischen Land man lebt, die Wange küssen. Das ist natürlich zwischen zwei Männern. Frauen hingegen fangen ihre Begrüßung mit Küssen und Umarmung an. In Deutschland fängt man die Begrüßung zwischen

Frauen und Männern mit einer höflichen Grußformel wie Guten Tag und dann mit Umarmung an. Blickkontakt gilt in Deutschland als Zeichen von Respekt und Höflichkeit.

Ein deutscher Spruch heißt „ein deutsches Nein heißt nein“. Wenn ein Deutscher zum Essen eingeladen wird und nein sagt, dann heißt es wirklich nein. In Jordanien hingegen Nein heißt „bitte frag mich noch mal „, schon interessant wie Kulturen zwischen Menschen und Ländern sich unterscheiden.

Die Zahl einer Familie spielt, abgesehen von der finanziellen Lage, immer eine große und wichtige Rolle in der arabischen Kultur. Denn die Araber früher haben die Zahl der Kinder als eine große Ehre gesehen, besonders männliche Kinder. Anfang der 20. Jahrhundert war auch die Zahl einer deutschen Familie groß wie die Araber. Im Laufe der Zeit hat es sich geändert. Jetzt beträgt die Zahl durchschnittlich bis 3 Kinder.

Ein typisches negatives Muster vieler Jordanier, dass sie überall rauchen, obwohl Gesetze geben, die verbieten es, aber daran halten sich die Leute nicht. Raucher in Deutschland haben in der Regel keine Zigarettenpause, aber sie können während der Arbeitszeit ca. 5 Minuten eine rauchen gehen. Diese ist zwar nicht offiziell gestattet, und könnte sogar die Kündigung drohen.

Ich bin der Meinung, dass das Wissen und Lernen anderer Kulturen sehr wichtig ist, damit man Missverständnisse vermeidet und nicht in peinlichen Situationen gerät. Wir sollten das Gute an unserer Kultur anderen Menschen beibringen und vom denen das Gute zu uns holen. Es geht hier nicht um richtig oder falsch, aber alle Menschen wünschen sich immer das beste in ihrem Leben.

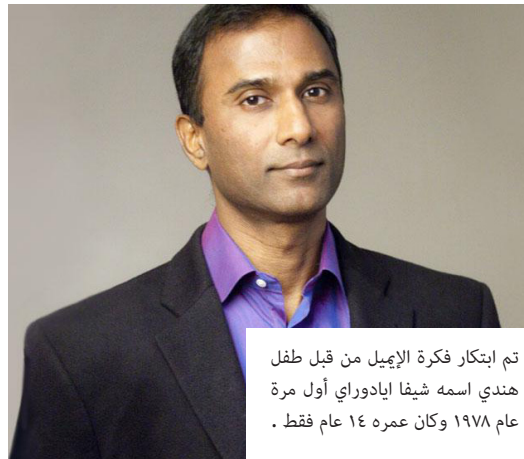

Thirty full days changed my perspective towards life. Though this does not necessarily mean that each millipart of my 2,592,000 seconds spent there were perfect. Within these thirty days, I have learnt 30 lessons, some I will mention and some should preferably remain hidden. Every human being confronts some hurdles, some bad days, and some unexpected situations with feudal people. By the same token, what I thought would be an obstacle, was not. In the meantime, few days were a bit frustrating for me, in which I faced some quandaries with people and life. One of the things was getting lost in the middle of the city. Many routes, many trams, many destinations and thousands of people all around. Yet, having to get lost many times with friends being around, started to sound funnier. It also taught us a lot, on how to depend on ourselves and having to put things together to survive.
