Overall Objectives of the Ta‘ziz Programme

Framework: The Ta‘ziz Partnership of the German Federal Foreign Office

The Federal Foreign Office supports democracy-building, reform processes, strengthening of civil society engagement

The DAAD Ta‘ziz Partnership: Long-term objectives

Supporting reform efforts in the higher education sectors and in the societies of the participating partner countries & strengthening of academic freedom

Involvement of non-university partners



Ta'ziz Partnership

Programme lines:

- Ta'ziz Short-Term Measures
- Ta'ziz Science Cooperations
- Ta'ziz Networking

Target groups:

Lecturers at higher education institutions, (junior) researchers, professors, higher education management staff, doctoral candidates, graduates and students from Germany and the partner countries

Special attention:

- Gender equality and diversity (participation of women and young adults)
- Involvement of non-university partners from Germany and the partner countries (science and research, public sector, business, civil society)



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Ta'ziz Short-Term Measures



Ta'ziz Short-Term Measures

Objectives: Establishing/expanding cooperation structures and/or the transfer of knowledge between partners, strengthening quality and competences in teaching, research and/or university management

What's behind it? Joint activities to initiate, intensify, expand and/or consolidate cooperation and knowledge exchange. For example: fact finding missions, exchange of students or scientists, (digital) conferences, summer schools

Particulars: max. funding of 10 months (within calendar year), max. EUR 40.000, two calls each year



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Technical Information - Eligibility and Partnership

- **Only German higher education or research institutions are eligible to apply** and are recipients of funding from the DAAD
- The application must involve **at least one partner university** from the target countries/target region
- **Regional networking** with several partners is encouraged within the allocated budget
- Involvement of **non-academic partners** is desired to achieve the program's objectives



Technical Information – Application Details

- The application includes a detailed **description of the specific objectives** to be achieved **and the indicators** to be used as signifiers
- **DAAD supports** project staff, material resources and mobility, **not** permanent staff, or large-scale equipment – nor only representational visits or individual research mobility.
- The call for application is **published in October** with 2 deadlines:
End of **November 2024**, for the funding period March-December 2025
End of **May 2025**, for the funding period September-December 2025

FAQ Ta'ziz Short-Term Measures

How do I find a German partner university? Research based on your field of expertise or subject area, consult the list of currently funded Ta'ziz projects, and search online for potential collaborations.

Who is involved in the funding decision process? Decisions on funding depend on headquarters, based on evaluations of the applications conducted by expert reviewers. The regional office does not award funds.



FAQ Ta'ziz Short-Term Measures

Why are there strict rules on how the funds can be used? Funding provided by the German Federal Foreign Office must comply with specific German financial laws. These rules are mandated by law and are beyond the DAAD's control.

What is the division of responsibilities between headquarters and regional offices in the application process? Headquarters advise German universities on the application process. Regional offices are responsible for local coordination and handling of enquiries, working closely with headquarters.
