EDUCATION AND PERFORMANCE

1. Programs

SABE consists of two departments that offer the bachelor degree, the department of Architecture and Interior Architecture, and the department of Design and Visual Communication.

At the master's level, the department of Ar-

chitecture and Interior Architecture offers two programs, M. Sc. Program in Spatial Planning and M.Sc. in Architectural Conservation. A Joint-Degree M.Sc. in Sustainable Buildings in cooperation with Koblenz University in Germany is in progress to be offered soon.

SABE General Programs

The school of Architecture and the Built Environment strives to use an interdisciplinary and integrated teaching environment that encompasses various fields of knowledge related to contemporary society. One of the key features is having a harmonious platform of teaching staff locally and internationally that incorporates academics and practition-

ers in the fields in a balanced set up. With programs in three disciplines – Architecture, Interior Architecture, Design and Visual Communication, the School of Architecture and the built environment is dedicated to integrate different courses and departments for the purpose of graduating skillful, creative, well-rounded students

B.Sc. Program in Architecture

This program prepares the candidates for a direct integration in the local, regional and international markets. The department of Architecture strives for encompassing interdisciplinarity in all courses, tries to bring in industrial expertise to enable students to work within real environments. It engages the study programs with partners from industry and local authorities to set forth market oriented teaching and graduates that are tailored to the market needs.

B.Sc. Program in Interior Architecture

This program prepares the candidates for a unique field of interest in a proactive manner. As the only stream in Jordan, it is planned and established in strong connection to the German partners since 2007, where a new vision of Architecture in Jordan is suggested. Adaptive reuse and inner architectural details are tackled in depth through the study plan to bring in better regeneration of settings, solving contemporary problems in architectural scenery

B.A. Program in Design and Visual Communication

An integrated design program incorporating graphic design, cinematography and TV production, multi-media and animation, and product design- the first and the only program in Jordan that deals with design and visual communication from an integrated perspective. It is also the first Program at the Bachelor level that concerns Cinema and TV Production.

M.Sc. Program in Spatial Planning

This one-of-a-kind graduate program in Spatial Planning as an interdisciplinary field of study incorporates multi-dimensional perspectives using problem-solving practical approaches to achieve integrated sustainable planning and urban design. Graduates are prepared to contribute to the contemporary built environment at the local, regional, and international arenas with their hands-on up-to-date theories and practices.

M.Sc. Program in Architectural Conservation

The Architectural Conservation Program provides knowledge and understanding of architectural conservation, along with practical conservation skills to preserve buildings and heritage sites. Students with high school certificate/ scientific stream and bachelor's degrees in architecture, interior design, cultural resources management, civil engineering, archaeology, or spatial urban planning can enroll in the program.

M.Sc. Program in Sustainable Buildings

This one-of-a-kind graduate program in Sustainable Buildings as an interdisciplinary field of study incorporates multi-dimensional perspectives using problem-solving practical approaches to achieve integrated sustainable building design, construction, evaluation and operation. Graduates are prepared to contribute to the contemporary built environment at the local, regional, and international arenas with their hands-on up-to-date theories and practices.

Admission Requirements

Bachelors Admission Requirements

- The Jordanian General Secondary Certificate or an equivalent certificate with a minimum average of 80% (Scientific Stream) for applicants to the B.Sc. Program in Architecture, and a minimum average of 70% (Scientific, IT, or Literary Streams) for applicants to the B.A. Program in Design and Visual Communication.
- Placement Exam and Admission Interview with Portfolio illustrating applicant abilities and development skills of the visual world using freehand sketching, photography, and computer media.

Masters Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's Degree, with minimum merit of GOOD, in a relevant field.
- TOEFL or an equivalent English Proficiency Test with a minimum score of 500.
- Admission interview.
- Portfolio that demonstrates projects undertaken during study and practice.
- Short Research Statement.
- Three Letters of Reference.
- C. V. illustrating the applicants' qualifications and experiences.
- To have a scientific major high school certificate.


1. Promotions





PROJECT PROPOSAL

»Cuisine in Jordan« – Cookbook with country impressions

Project Outline Jordan

The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan is an amazing country and once the focus of attention with many surprising discoveries. Having contacts in personal and business to Jordan means access to a network that covers the whole Middle East region. Thanks to its central geographical position Jordan has always been a melting pot of different cultures. Numerous historical sites all over the country show the heritage of Roman, Christian and Arabic Culture. Nowadays Jordan is considered to be a quiet and safe place, which accepts numerous waves of refugees and migrants from the surrounding countries. Supported by the Hashemite Royal Family, the Jordanian society is relatively tolerant of different lifestyles and religions and is open to social and technological advancements. Thanks to the cultural heritage and impressive landscape, Jordan benefits from astonishing touristic sites, which are famous worldwide. Petra is considered one of the highest-ranking seven world wonders. Due to the the strategic impor- tance of the country the German Government invested in the sector of education

and in 2005 the German Jordanian University in Amman was established as an inter-cultural meeting place and highly important proiect in bilateral relations between the two countries.

But the tourism sector as one of the main economical fields and the reputation of the whole country as business location are more and more suffering from the political problems and violence in the surrounding countries. Among Germans there is still little knowledge concerning the potential this country has to offer.

Academic exchange Hochschule RheinMain – German Jordanian University

The study program of Design and Visual Communication at the German Jordanian University started in fall 2008, based on a concept of Communication Design at the University RheinMain in Wiesbaden as the responsible German partner and support of the Media Designers at the University for Applied Sciences in Mainz. Since 2010 the design programs are exchanging students and teaching staff frequently and there's the strong wish on both sides to proceed to the next level of collaboration with a complex joint student project in the field of print media and film



Project Idea

Following the intention to extend the collaboration between the departments and to offer mutual cultural experiences to the involved students and external partners, we are proposing a complex media project which will generate publicity on a professional level and raise the interest and knowledge about Jordan in Germany. The idea is to create a professional high quality cookbook in combination with an online video platform.

The cookbook will contain recipes, which represent all the different ethnic groups forming Jordan's con-temporary society — a peaceful melting pot located in the center of the Middle East. Aside from the famous national dish »Mansaf« the cookbook will have recipes of the Bedouins, the Cherkessians, and other ethnic groups from Syria, Lebanon, Palestine, Iraq and other countries surrounding Jordan. All of which, are culinary delights served in fami-lies and restaurants in Jordan.

Language: Cookbook and videos will be bilingual in German and English.

In addition, the cookbook will include a lot of information and pictures presenting the country of Jordan with its different facets (depending on the students' final concepts) such as:

- landscape and nature, flora and fauna
- cities and countryside
- touristic sites
- cultural heritage and traditions
- modern lifestyle and technology
- contemporary art and cultural life
- ethnic and religious diversity
- political history
- the Royal family
- economy and industry
- environmental and nature protection (water, recycling, eco tourism, etc

The video documentaries will focus on helpful step-by-step instructions and interesting and typical Jordanian coo- king events, maybe also Jordan's attractions, but seen with the eyes of young filmmakers.

Why A Cookbook?

Beyond a common trend in Germany (interest in cookshows and cookbooks) at the moment, there are several reasons to publish a cookbook: it is a very clever and somehow innocent packaging to reach extremely large target groups and to achieve a long-term effect. Foreign cuisine is always welcome in Germany. It is the first public indicator of a cultural group arriving somewhere in the world and it is usually the last piece of heritage remaining within families over generations when language and other habits have long been lost. Regardless of education and social status everybody loves memories of family meetings and traditional recipes thus cooking always has a positive connotation and gesture of friendship and hospitality. While cooking and eating together, people automatically begin to talk and get in contact in a friendly way. A cookbook represents the same harmless atmosphere. It has the great advantage that it is used frequently – even by people who are not interested in other books. The project »Cuisine in Jordan« counts on this effect, but offers much more than recipes. While cooking and waiting for the meal, there is plenty of time to thumb through the book and discover the facts and pictures about Jordanian life and culture which invite everybody to visit or get in touch with the culture and the country.

Germany has a large population of immigrants and growing numbers of mixed foreign-German couples, fa- milies and teams at school, at university, in companies, organizations, sports and all parts of social life. The cultural cross-over is fluent and expanding. Without attracting attention, people of foreign descent contribute a lot to social life and economy in Germany - far beyond restaurants and exotic shops, but there is not much awareness of the situation and little is known, especially about the culture and language of countries in the Arabic-speaking world. If regarding the demographic changes in Germany, as a great potential and a sociopolitical chance, the project »Cuisine in Jordan« could contribute to a positive attitude towards cultural diversity





Synopsis:

Infrastructural development in Amman was largely shaped by the political economy of the British Mandate. Funding of infrastructure came from three discrete funding streams; imperial funds from the CDF, private foreign capital granted concessions, and investment by local actors. All of these interactions helped to develop a new bureaucratic class in Amman.

Short Bio:

Harrison Guthorn is a current PhD candidate in Modern Middle East History at the University of Maryland, College Park. His research interests include nationalism, urban development, and Colonial Mandate politics. Harrison's current research focuses on the development of Amman during the British Mandate Period.



6. The Abdelliya School

is one of the three oldest primary schools in Amman. It was established in 1934. Al-Abdaliya School started its first beginnings in Beit Shuqair on Kharfan Street in Jabal Amman, then moved in 1940 to the house of Sidqi al-Qasim, and then it assumed its current location in Beit Shashaa in 1975, which is One of the Omani heritage houses built in the thirties of the twentieth century.

The school currently includes about 200 students in the basic stage (from the fourth grade to the seventh grade), within an area not exceeding two hundred square meters, and next to it is a site that includes three of the heritage buildings that were donated by the prominent national investor, Mr. Othman Badir, to the German Jordanian University. Believing in the university's mission to serve the requirements of the national industry, and in support of the distinguished achievement it has achieved during the previous years, and in his belief in the necessity of continuous communication between the private

and public sectors to enrich the education process in Jordan.

The university is currently working on diversifying its programs to include specialized programs to serve the Jordanian community.

The rehabilitation works of the Abdelliya School building started in 2011 and was finished in 2013 by the efforts of teamwork including school staff members and gju engineers and workers as a part of the community outreach.

the process of rehabilitation included: cleaning the external buildings and re-aligning their external stone walls, re-installing cornices on the building, implementing new networks for the infrastructure of electricity, , water and central heating, maintenance of metal and wooden doors and windows, re-establishing toilets, cleaning floors, and isolating Roofs, painting, restoration of stairs, and furniture, And followed by rehabilitation works for the yard, external fence and sidewalk.







7. Quantity Surveying

Back to School

Quantity Surveying (QS) profession has played a major role in overcoming many construction challenges around the world. This profession is recognized by a number of professional bodies around the world, but most notably it is governed and regulated by the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS) www. rics.org. Due to the growth and changes in the construction industry in Jordan, the need for the Quantity Surveying profession has become essential and is swiftly being recognised by the Jordan Engineering Society, government and financial institutions.

German Jordanian University (GJU) together with Nabih Elias Azzam & Partners (NEA) a leading Quantity Surveying firm www.neame.com, (the first Arab company and the only regulated Arab firm by the RICS) have developed the only Professional Diploma in Quantity Surveying (PDQS) course in Jor-

dan, delivering both theoretical and practical courses in Quantity Surveying.

PD-QS is aimed at professionals holding degrees in Engineering and Architecture. It is also suitable for anyone pursuing a career in Quantity Surveying and related disciplines and having a particular interest and specializing in all or some aspects of Quantity Surveying. PDQS is designed to provide the principals, tools and techniques for the commercial management of construction projects. It will prepare a candidate to be a pro-active quantity surveyor with a good grasp of the breadth of topics which are important in the industry. This program does not lead to an academic degree, and its training hours do not count in case the trainee wishes to continue his/her studies for such a degree.









7. Alia specialized industries competition for an Olive Oil Mill Design

The German Jordanian University's (GJU) Students, Lin Hussein, and Zaid Al Qarra have won first place in Alia specialized industries competition for an Olive Oil Mill Design.

Alia Specialized industries have been an olive oil producer since 2001, and is planning on setting up a new production facility.

The Department of Architecture and Interior Architecture/ GJU and Alia specialized industries had promoted an architectural competition among young architects – for both graduates and under-graduate students.

The Competition successfully presented a unique opportunity to investigate and utilize architectural design techniques and building

materials from different perspectives exposing participants to real-life projects, with the assistance of our GJU instructors in developing fulfilled results.

Participants competed and were evaluated by diverse juries of experts at SABE (Prof. Ziyad Haddad, Dr. Maram Tawil, Dr. Farah Alatrash, Arch. Bisher Zuraikat, Arch. Mohammad Khalid and Arch. Tala Mukheimer).

It is worth mentioning that both winners (Lin and Zaid) were very comparative and therefore the jurors took the decision to give both of them the first rank and divided the sum of first prize and second prize on both participants.

As a visionary approach for gju the theory vs practice was implemented when GJU moved the premises of School of Architecture and Built Environment SABE to the downtown of Amman, where the real social life of the capital was born and exists, to an old building named Darat Othman Bedeir after the name of the benefactor.

Jabal Amman overlooking Amman Downtown, Jabal Al-Webdeh, and Amman Citadel Hill. Consisting of two building:1- A heritage building dating back to the 1930s approx. 500 sq.m. 2- A heritage commercial building dating back to the 1950s: approx. 2500 sq.m. the renovation work consisted multi layering methods with the efforts of the school staff and students.




Introduction

After the School of Architecture and Built Environment SAB Emoved to the downtown of Amman, where the real social life of the capital was born and exists, to an old building named Darat Othman Bdeir after the name of the benefactor the Future Expansion need araised To fully satisfy the school needs and requirements, we rented a close building (about 600 m2) across the road from the Darat Othman Bdeir, still the school is in need for more spaces within more integrated forms. That's when the idea of the house of Ibrarim Hashim (the adjacent plot of land) came into life.

Who is Ibrahim Hashim's?

Ibrahim Hashim was the Head of the Executive Council of the Emirates of TransJordan and later the first Prime Minister of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan in 1946.

In the 1930s, Ibrahim Hashim built his home in the land plot just beside the current Darat Othman Bdeir







Bait Ibrahim Hashem is representative of residential buildings erected in Amman during the period of the British mandate (1920-1948). Built to varying degrees of sophistication, these houses bore the influence of urban villas developed in the more established urban centers of Palestine and Lebanon over the course of the 19th and early 20th centuries. Yet as vernacular iterations of these more sophisticated models, they also reflected the provincial character of the newly established Transjordanian capital. Like many of these buildings, the Ibrahim Hashem house fell on hard times in the second half of the 20th century as Amman's wealthier citizens moved on to newer and larger homes to the west of the city's historic center.1

The Hashem house can be understood as belonging to a type of house known regionally as a three-aisle or center hall villa. These houses are found in old urban centers throughout the region known as the Levant or the Bilad al-Sham, including parts of what are now Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Israel, and the Palestinian Territories. Built primarily of stone, they are characterized by a typical plan arranged around a large central hall flanked by bedrooms and sometimes by bathrooms, kitchens, and other rooms. Generally their arrangement was expressed on the exterior by a symmetrical main facade organized around a tripartite ensemble comprised of a

central door bracketed between two narrow windows corresponding to the main hall.

The agreement that GJU intends to implement with Greater Amman's Municipality GAM

Out of a generous gesture and out of its interest to properly develop Amman and enhance its neighborhoods, GAM agreed to offer GJU the building of Ibrahim Hashim's house in return of GJU doing the renovation, service the area, and enhance the quality of life there.

The period of the agreement is 10 years, while the expected cost of renovation would range up to 700000 seven hundred Jordanian Dinars.

Steps taken and planned

Two committees where formed and a workshop was conducted. The committees suggested the a tentative hierarchical managerial system of renovating Ibrahim Hashim's house in case it was acquired; and defined the needed spaces for the college to be accommodated in the house.


