

## Admission Requirements

### Undergraduate Programs:

The Jordanian General Secondary School Certificate (Tawjihi) or its equivalent, such as Arab or foreign certificates (IB, IGCSE/GCE, HSD & SAT II) with the following minimum admission average:

- Engineering Programs and Architecture:  
80% - scientific stream
- Design and Visual Communication and Languages:  
70% - scientific, literary and IT streams
- Management:  
75% - scientific, literary and IT streams
- Computer Science:  
75% - scientific and IT streams.

Students applying to study Architecture, Design and Visual Communication, or Translation must sit for an entrance exam

### Graduate Programs:

- Undergraduate degree in a related field from a recognized university with a minimum merit of "good".
- English Language proficiency test :
  - (IELTS) test with a grade not less than 6, or
  - (TOFEL iBT) test with a minimum score 61, or
  - The National English Language test with a minimum score of 75%.

### General:

- English is the medium of instruction for all undergraduate and graduate programs. German is the medium of instruction during the German year.
- Applications, with the minimum requirements, does not guarantee acceptance, as acceptance is highly competitive.

## The German Year:

### General:

- All students, at the Bachelor level, must spend one year in Germany; studying for one semester at a partner university and fulfilling 20 weeks internship in the German industries as a compulsory requirements of graduation.
- Students are responsible of all the financial expenses during the German Year, which is around 8,000 - 10,000 JD.
- GJU Project Office in Germany, run by the strategic partner "HS Magdeburg Stendal", provides the logistic and administrative support for GJU students during their stay in Germany.

### German Language Center (GLC):

- The largest university-based German language center worldwide.
- Offering intensive German language training for all Bachelor degree students; reaching level B1 before going to Germany.

### International Office (IO):

- Facilitating placements in the host partner universities, with a network of more than 90 partner German universities.
- Organizing German scholarship programs related to GJU
- Facilitating staff exchange (Train the Trainers, Flying Faculty program).

### Office of Industrial Links (OIL):

- Preparing highly skilled graduates with relevant knowledge to industry.
- Training students to find internships as a part of the educational process to compete with German applicants for internships.
- Conducting application training and announcing internship offers within the German industry.
- Providing Data-Base of potential internship placements.

### Exchange Coordinators:

- Following up the academic aspects with the German partner universities, including the preparing of the "Learning Agreements" in coordination with the IO.
