Prof. Dr. Anton Mangstl


At the beginning of the new semester, the Vice President for International Affairs, Prof. Dr. Anton Mangstl, welcomes all students at the GJU. As the German Vice President he stresses out the focus on GJU's responsibility for further developments regarding the Year in Germany.

Furthermore he points out that the mandatory Germany Year is an outstanding unique feature and that the acquired knowledge and language skills (Arabic, English and German) of GJU graduates prepare them very well for the labor market in the region and in Germany.

Therefore the GJU meets the demanding motto "Education for Employment (e4e)" of the International Finance Corporation (IFC). Prof. Mangstl makes clear that the GJU students have during their stay in Germany the chance to contribute to a better understanding between the European and Arab culture.

In the end Prof. Dr. Mangstl highlights that in January 2013, in cooperation with the Goethe Institute, GJU students were given the opportunity to certify their German language skills in a recognized examination (B1) for the first time. He is proud that 70% of the participants passed the exam.

He wishes all - students, staff and faculty - a successful semester.

























# Darat Othman Bdeir for Innovation and Entrepreneurship

Within its responsibility towards Amman and its heritage, the German Jordanian University (GJU) has started the rehabilitating of a heritage site in the olden sectors of Amman and transforming it into a forum for the students and young professionals at the University. This project is named «Darat Othman Bdeir for Innovation and Entrepreneurship», after the name of the donor. In March 2011, the "House or Dara" was handed over to GJU and the preparation phase of the conservation process was launched in April 2011. The conservation activities started in July 2011 and expected to be completed in July 2013. The Dara was officially opened on 20.1.2013 under the patronage of HRH Princess Muna Al-Hussein.

Although Amman has witnessed a number of conservation projects in the past few years, the majority of these projects were limited to providing leisure activities with minimal positive impacts on the local communities.

The "Dara" will be branded as "A Platform for Innovation and Competitiveness". It does not have any ideological or political agenda that might influence or direct its activities.

The role of the "Dara" includes:

- Providing a design production house to utilize the creative abilities of the students and young professionals of GJU through three programs; the atelier, the entrepreneur, and the charrette.
- Providing a forum for students and young professionals through the membership and fellowship programs.
- Establishing a certified training centre that offers a number of short training courses covering emerging and advanced software packages in design.
- Raising cultural awareness among school students through involving them in a number of activity programs for that purpose.
- Organizing Summer Camps as learning festivals covering a wide range of activities such as, emotional intelligence, innovation and consciousness.
- Celebrating the unique Ammani experiences through documenting and presenting its' tangible and intangible significances.
- Establishing a "Performing Arts Centre" covering dancing and choreography, music, theatre and drama, broadcasting, screen arts, etc.
- · Establishing a Knowledge Centre.
- Community capacity building and development through a number of programs that will be conducted on regular basis; weekly, monthly, seasonally, and/or annually.
- Presenting Al-Abdalia School as a model "public" school that enjoys an appropriate learning environment and extra curriculum activities.

# My German Year


It all started on the 1st of March 2012 where my first trip to Europe was the trip that turned my world 360 degrees. You start out excited and cautious of things around you but unfortunately have a negativity carried with you from your culture towards being exposed to everything and everyone new. The first thing a person must leave Jordan with is openness, without it they might be lost in the urge of wanting to fit in. In my time in Jordan, it wasn't only about being a student that studied and hung out with his friends; it was about learning from my professors how to be a leader through my education. I then realized, we work so hard to learn so much from them that we forget how much we can teach them as well. There is a stereotype that goes around where we believe that they are perfectionists but the truth is they are just humans like you and I. As soon as you stop underestimating your knowledge and qualifications you realize how much you are the best representative of your country, culture and the representative of yourself as well.

Another fear was the acceptance of the people towards me. A small but lovely city as Fulda, Hessen, you would think that people are all the same and had very narrow thoughts. On the contrary, it was a student filled city with a keen passion towards our food, music, language and lifestyle. Here my responsibility really kicked in to teach them more about us and ending a semester with a large group ready to come discover our country with an equal passion of when we go to Germany.

It mostly sums up to respecting others and their opinions although it might not be the same as yours. This might all sound cliché but it is the truth. You grow as a person, you become independent, responsible, and you can judge yourself for your decisions. Without your



family, culture nor traditions pushing on you to make decisions, you reach an inner peace with yourself because when you are all alone you decide all on your own how you want your life to be. Mostly it's either you lose yourself or find yourself here.

# My internship experience at BOSCH

Application processes is also a difficult phase here as well. When you apply to +100 companies and you reach a point where you are homeless and jobless, it is then when your patience kicks in. Until you get that one call or email. For me it was the first call, when Robert Bosch believed in what the passion in my CV spoke about. The team leader of one of the biggest companies in Europe "Bosch" offered me a 10 month internship instead of 5 after only 2 hours of an intriguing phone call where I spent 70 min talking about myself and my achievements in Jordan. You see here you realize it was about hard work and dedication in Jordan; Jordan can build you if you want it to.

In the beginning it was all about friends, exchange, travelling, tourist sites but it ended up in shaping a family with members from +12 countries around the globe. I integrated the Jordanian culture as well and the great culture and hospitality it offers while learning. The people felt the pride and belief in me and so the people believed in me too. When we accept each other we can together draw a shining future. I took on this journey to then realize that I can make a change in my country when I get such an amazing experience like this. Coming back is when you realize you've changed and become more patient. 

# Goodbye Germany – Hello GJU! The story of German 'incoming' students on campus

Part of the philosophy of GJU is to encourage the mobility of students in both directions – hundreds of students go TO Germany, as part of their obligatory German Year. But since 2009 a growing number of students also are coming from Germany to study at GJU for a semester: 80 so called 'incoming' students joined GJU so far, for a study semester. These students came from 30 different partner universities in Germany, and they studied 18 different subjects in all of our Schools. As students of one of our 76 partner universities these 'incomings' are not required to pay tuition at GJU. The School of Management has been especially attractive for the German students: more than a third of all 'incomings' was enrolled in that School.

This semester 14 German students are here, they share several apartments in one building. 'Study buddies' that were assigned to them prior to their arrival help to familiarize themselves with campus live and with living in

Jordan. GJU's International Office facilitates all logistics involved with their arrival on campus, and also organizes an 'incoming' orientation week with seminars about Jordanian culture and history. IO staff takes the students to touristic sites and different neighborhoods of Amman, and introduce them to Amman's nightlife.

The incoming students thoroughly enjoy the immersion experience of studying and living in another culture. But they also praise the academic quality of their study programs, says Christine Ackstaller, a business student from the FH Regensburg who just extended her stay at GJU for a second term: "The smaller class sizes allow more access to and interaction with the instructors than in Germany!".

Once the students return to their home universities they spread the word and encourage more students to come to GJU – this word of mouth propaganda seems to work very well and we hope to welcome many more German students at GJU in the future!

# The English Course at GJU: Reflections



# My "CrossCulture Internship" at the University of Cologne in Germany

In his article, Azmi Al-Nawayseh, a former GJU student and a current employee at the International Office in GJU, reflects on his positive experience when participating in the CrossCulture Internship Program, which took place last summer in the University of Applied Sciences of Cologne in Germany. Azmi has been eager to enroll in this cultural exchange program offered by the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He seized the first available opportunity to represent the German Jordanian University at this internship program in the International Office at the Cologne University of Applied Sciences.

During the two-month training, Azmi was in constant contact with the IO at GJU. His mission in Germany included the following:

- Representative of Jordan and the German Jordanian University in the annual meeting of the subscribers in the CrossCulture Internship Stuttgart, Germany.
- Coordinator of the German language program for GJU exchange students at Cologne University.
- Representative of Jordan and the GJU in the quarterly meeting with the German students interested in studying in the Arab World.

# Athletic Unit at GJU



# Studying in Green Surroundings – Introducing Magdeburg-Stendal University of Applied Sciences

The Magdeburg-Stendal University of Applied Sciences is responsible for what is currently the largest project in the DAAD's "Study Courses Offered by German Universities Abroad" programme. With its commitment to the development of the German-Jordanian University (GJU) in accordance with the template provided by German universities of applied sciences, it is making an important contribution to the export of education. In the 2009/2008 winter semester, the first students from the GJU came to the university for their study visit abroad, and many more were to follow.





# 2 sites, 7 departments, 6,500 students and excellent facilities

At the Magdeburg site the university offers around 50 Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in the five departments of Civil Engineering, Engineering and Industrial Design, Communications and Media, Social and Health Sciences and Water and Waste Management. The Stendal site has two departments – Applied Human Sciences and Economics. Both sites have excellent facilities, for example the two libraries, state-of-the-art technology in the laboratories and wireless internet access throughout the entire campus. Both sites score points with their green, excellently equipped campuses, modern laboratories and renovated teaching buildings, new refectories and sports grounds.

### Master's Degree in Cooperation with the GJU

Since the winter semester of 2013/2012, in cooperation with the GJU, Magdeburg-Stendal University of Applied Sciences has offered a study programme with an international double degree in Specialized Translation Arabic/German/English. Graduates of this course are able to produce technically and factually correct translations of specialist texts in the fields of law, technology and economics. This equips them with the skills to obtain employment in specialist translation, multilingual terminology work, and technical and corporate communication with international and domestic companies, organizations and authorities.

### Study course - practical and up-to-date

The university is breaking new ground with degree courses such as Psychology of Rehabilitation, Health Promotion and Management, Safety and Hazard Defence and Innovative Management. Magdeburg-Stendal University of Applied Sciences focuses on knowledge and research transfer and maintains close contacts with regional and international industry. 
### Naturally international

Petra is one of the most spectacular cities in the Middle East, located in the east of Wadi Araba in Jordan and has long attracted travelers and explorers. The historical evidence mentioned Petra and its surrounding since the new kingdom Egypt (1550 BC) as it was listed in the Egyptian campaigns to the Levant as well as in the Amarna letters as Pel, Sela or Sier. The Bible mentioned Petra as Sela in a few places as the "Rock" in the second book of the Kings XIV and in 2 Chronicles XXV. Petra was mentioned as Rekem in the Aramaic inscriptions, which were found in the rock wall of Wadi Musa near the entrance however, this inscription was buried under a bridge instruction that was constructed about two decades ago. The name Petra comes from the Latin word Petrae meaning the Rock.

The Nabataean, the inhabitants of Petra, are one of the many Arabian tribes migrated to the region from Arabia. The nomadic tribe the Nabataean carved grandiose buildings, temples and tombs cut out of solid sandstone rock. They constructed walls to protect the city and they were skilled water engineers and traders.

Petra started to be known in 312 BC. During the Hellenistic period of the Seleucids and the Ptolemies the whole area flourished with trade. Petra became the center of spice trade from Arabia to the south passing Amman and then going to Basra, Damascus and Palmyra. It was a wealthy commercial crossroad between Arabia and Assyria. The most remarkable achievements of the Nabataean are the hydraulic engineering system that they developed including their water conservations system and the dams that were constructed to divert winter water.

Petra was the capital of the Nabataean. Its main feature is the Siq – a long narrow gorge surrounded with high colorful sandstone rocks that leads the visitor to the magnificent scene of the famous Al-

Kazneh - known as "The Treasury". The Bedouins believed that the Pharaoh chasing the Israelites hid his treasure on top of the Kazneh, which was carved in the rock.

In the year 64-63 BC, the Nabataean were conquered by the Roman general Pompey, however, he retained an independent Nabataea which was taxed by the Romans and served as a buffer zone against the desert tribes. The whole area including Petra was subsumed by the Romans under the emperor Trajan in 106 A.D and became part of the Roman province known as Arabia Petraea with Petra as the capital.

Many Roman monuments were built in Petra around this time such as the triumphal arch. In 363 A.D the city was partly ruined by an earthquake. However, Petra retained its importance when it became the center of the Byzantine Bishopric. The Byzantine reused some of the site structures and also constructed their own churches and the Monastery" Ad- Dier" was modified into a church.

With the change of the trade routes, Petra's commercial position declined and an earthquake impacted the whole city around 551 A.D. Petra was revealed to the western world since the crusaders by the Swiss traveler Johann Ludwig Burckhardt in 1812.

In 1985, Petra was listed in the world heritage and in 2007 was voted for as one of the world's seven wonders. Petra is visited by hundreds of thousands every year and regarded as the most important touristic attraction in Jordan.

Petra was the main topic of a poem by John William Burgon and a song by the Lebanese brothers Al Rahbani in 1977. It also featured in films like the famous "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade" and appeared in many novels such as "Appointment with Death" by Agatha Christie.


