The main objective of this visit was to inquire whether GEBC as a major serves the market at the business, cultural and educational communication levels, and how it ensures that its graduates find jobs as soon as they graduate from SAHL, GJU.

A proactive member in society, Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Organization (TAG-Org) has established TAGBC.FM to cater to society's best interest by tackling public and local issues, which in turn aid in boosting the local economy. Moreover, the radio station aims to spread social, educational, and economic awareness. TAGBC.FM broadcasts economic and educational programs, in addition to classical music in Amman and Ma'an governorate. Furthermore, the station will broadcast around the clock in four languages: standard Arabic, French, Chinese, and Italian.

Upon arriving at the station, GEBC students were given an overview about



the station and the local initiatives the organization has accomplished so far. Thereafter, the students were shown how programs are prerecorded and how live on air works. In addition, they got the chance to live an off air experience in which they were interviewed by Mr. Ali Karjawally, Manager of TAG-BC.FM.

The students talked with Mr. Karjawally about their plans for the future, why they chose their major and where they see themselves after they graduate. More importantly, they asked about how they can ensure internship opportunities

during their studies or after they graduate.

The visit encouraged the students to consider the media industry in their future career path and enabled them to get a closer look into how a Radio station operates. within the construction industry.

Furthermore, students will be able to apply their knowledge and understanding on practical scenarios designed to simulate services by the Quantity Surveyor, and they will understand the different elements of construction and accordingly manage costs effectively and fairly across the board.

The Diploma will be delivered over nine months split into two semesters; the timing of the lectures will be in the evening and on weekends.

She mentioned that OIL established the Program Innovation & Entrepreneurship (PIE), to create an innovation and startup culture besides developing Technology Transfer.

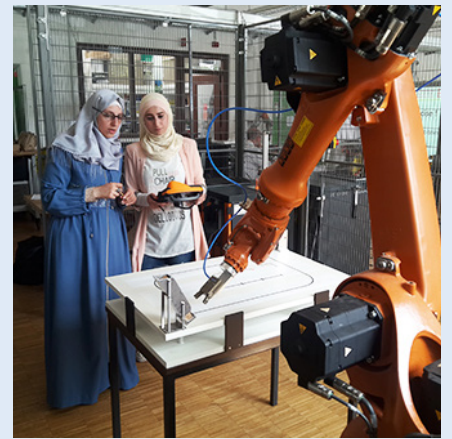
Erasmus+ Project trains Mechatronics Engineers on KUKA Robots at HS Bochum

GJU Mechatronics Department, engineers Alaa Alshubbak and Marwa Alfaouri have participated in a 10-day training on KUKA industrial robots at Hochschule Bochum benefiting from an Erasmus+ mobility grant.

The training spanned the period from 2018/7/23 to 2018/8/3 and included work on KUKA industrial robots, open source programming, and handling a 7-DoF cooperative robot.

During their stay, our engineers had the chance to meet the President of HS Bochum, visit a coal firing power plant, STAEG company, and at 60 meters, the highest cold-water geyser in the world at Andernach.

The Erasmus+ project is managed by Dr. Rolf Biesenbach at Hochschule Bochum, Dr. Nathir Rawashdeh at the German Jordanian University, and Dr. Tarek Tutunji at Philadelphia University.



Global Politics Summer School Jordan 2018 Migration in the Middle East and Europe: Challenges and opportunities



The German Jordanian University (GJU) and the Center for Global Political at Freie University – Berlin joined efforts for the seventh time to organize the Global Politics Seasonal School (GPSS) from 28th of August until the 9th of September 2018.

The GPSS invites students from the Middle East and Europe to take part in a rigorous intercultural learning experience, in which the guiding theme for 2018 is Migration in the Middle East and Europe: Challenges and opportunities. Discussions will cover recent developments in the MENA region and Europe with a special focus on migration.

Prof. Klaus Segbers Director of the Center for Global Politics (CGP) stated, "As the world is becoming ever more complex, contradictory and fragile such international programs aim to help participants to navigate emerging

complexities." "With this years' guiding theme (Migration in the Middle East and Europe: Challenges and opportunities) we hope to stir the discussion with peers, exchange thoughts, future scenarios, and come up with possible solutions to outmaneuver dangerous development."

From her side, Vice president of GJU Dr. Dorit Schumann said that this year's topic sits well with Jordan and Amman's historical role in harboring Arab and non-Arab refugees from all different parts of the region and the world for a variety of reasons.

The program modules and discussions include new approaches to global politics that will be covered by Prof. Klaus Segbers as he will present recent developments in the field and shed light on the most pressing issues. Complementing the European view, Prof. Zhenjiang Zhang will shed light on the Chinese perspective on Global challenges and trends.

Moreover, Nadine Biehler and Amrie Meier from the Global Issues Division at the German Institute for International and Security Affairs will explore the phenomena of and forced displacement as well as the potentials and risks they entail from a European

perspective.

The second module with a focus on migration flows in the MENA region, where Mohamad Bader and Nadia Shamroukh from Jordanian Women's Union will report from their practical perspective. On another hand, Prof. Paul Tabar and Prof. Helga Baumgarten will discuss migration from an academic view.

In another module, Flexi Karstens, from the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology Zurich will focus on Europe's role at the regional and global stage. While Ambassador Omar Rifai will take a similar approach for his political analysis on challenges and opportunities

In the end, all modules will be closed by a simulation game that will be conducted by Charlotte Wiesenthal a trainer at planpolitik company, where participants will try to handle the increasing influx of refugees to the "Inotian Union"

It is worthy to mention that the program is supported by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), the Federal Ministry of Education and Research as well as GJU and Heinrich Boll Stiftung Palestine and Jordan.
