# The GJU Manages EDU-Syria program

EDU-SYRIA program is a series of EU-funded projects through the EU Regional Trust Fund in Response to the Syrian Crisis (Madad Fund), and the Neighborhood Instrument (ENI), which are managed by the German Jordanian University. EDU-SYRIA came as a response action to help Syrian refugees and the host communities in Jordan overcome the Syrian crisis consequence through granting the youth of Syrian refugees and underprivileged Jordanians an access to higher education through a set of scholarships.

# The German Jordanian University Launches the Children University



The German Jordanian University will launch the Children University, also known as “Little Professor” program in August, 2022. The aim of this program is to enhance scientific thinking and creativity in children and introduce them to the method of university learning through their participation in several interactive lectures.

Moreover, the program which will be launched at the university’s main campus in Mushaqar is set to target school students between the ages of (8-12) from different regions in the Kingdom. It will be supervised by the university’s staff and the German Technical University of Braunschweig.



# GJU Obtains the German Certificate of equivalency for 13 Programs in 4 Schools



The German Jordanian University (GJU) has obtained accreditation certificates from the German Accreditation Council for programs administered outside Germany for thirteen majors in four schools as the following:



- The School of Humanities and Applied Languages (SAHL): Bachelor of Translation: German - Arabic - English, German and English for Business and Communication, and in German as a Foreign Language for the Master's level.
- The School of Applied Medical Sciences (SAMS): Bachelor of Biomedical Engineering, Pharmaceutical and Chemical Engineering programs.
- The School of Applied Technical Sciences (SATS): Bachelor of Industrial Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Maintenance, Mechatronics Engineering and Artificial Intelligence, and Master of Engineering Management.
- The School of Management and Logistics Sciences (SMLS): Bachelor of International Accounting, Logistics Sciences, Administrative Sciences, and Master of Logistics Sciences.

# Hosted Programs

The German Jordanian University aligns with its framework to excel in education and provide high-quality programs that mirror modern international standards. These programs cater to the specific needs of the German and European markets while empowering young individuals with specialized knowledge in distinct technological or social fields. Moreover, the university is pivotal in fostering strong ties between Jordan and Germany.

To achieve these objectives, the university has taken the initiative to host the Technical University of Applied Sciences Würzburg-Schweinfurt (THWS), a German university, and their unique programs on its campus in Amman. This strategic move aims to prepare Jordanian students for a Bachelor's degree in selected majors highly demanded in the German and international job markets. Simultaneously, it also attracts foreign students who aspire to enter the German market through the gateway provided by the German Jordanian University, thus benefiting students, the university, and the country.

The partnership started by hosting THWS after the Higher Education Council approved establishing two academic programs: B.A. Social Work Transnational and B. Eng. Hydrogen Technology Transnational—the region's only program of its kind.



# The Consultation and Training Center at GJU Obtains the Vocational and Technical Training and Education License



The Consultation and Training Center (CTC) at the German Jordanian University (GJU) obtained a vocational and technical training and education license from the Vocational and Technical Skills Development Authority, whose board of directors is chaired by the Minister of Labor.

The license enables the CTC to provide training and vocational education services in administrative, financial, computer, agricultural, pharmaceutical, renewable energy, water and sanitation, construction professions, blacksmithing, welding, carpentry, and decoration.



# GJU Organizes the Applied University Teaching International Conference



The German Jordanian University (GJU) organized the “Applied University Teaching International Conference” in cooperation with Magdeburg-Stendal University of Applied Sciences in Germany.
